Context

The Synod Interfaith Relationships Committee has been tasked with encouraging throughout the Synod an understanding of other religious faiths and promoting relationships with members of other religious faiths.

Report

An ongoing project is working with the Assembly Relations with Other Faiths Working Group to develop a study guide to accompany the Uniting Church document *Friendship in the Presence of Difference*.

Promoting relationships with members of other religious faiths

In addition to networking on a regular basis, two events have been specifically organised or hosted by SIRC. They are:

- Journeying together to enrich communities (Middle Ridge Uniting Church, Toowoomba)
- Gatherings of people of Christian and Muslim faiths with Sheik Alsharif ibn Hashim Alhusaini Almadani (a lunchtime leaders' meeting at the Uniting Church Centre, Auchenflower and a public meeting at St Francis Theological College, Milton).

Key achievements/initiatives

2015 annual lecture: Living the faith in a pluralistic society

This event was held at the Uniting Church Centre on 18 March 2015. Rev Dr David Pitman was the guest speaker. This was a Uniting Church information workshop to clarify how the Uniting Church understands, accepts and engages in interfaith relationships.

The goal was to have shared understanding on how we as members of the Uniting Church engage in interfaith relationships. What is our attitude and approach? David Pitman gave a summary of the Assembly documents in terms of encouraging us to be a neighbour. There is strong advocacy for shared community and there is certainly opportunity to get together, share meals, and have joint projects in the community.

However, the ongoing questions are: How do we as the Uniting Church engage in interfaith relationships? How do we live together? How does the church faithfully proclaim the gospel? How do we welcome the stranger and the alien? We believe that the spirit is here and the Spirit of God is alive and active in every context.

Journeying together to enrich communities

28 March 2015, Middle Ridge Uniting Church, Toowoomba

This event was jointly organised by the Synod Interfaith Relationships Committee and the Multifaith Multicultural Centre of Toowoomba. It highlighted the work of the Queensland Alliance and the Goodwill Committee of Toowoomba. People from a variety of faith and community organisations were in attendance. Speakers included Dave Copeman, Rev David Baker, Haniff Razak, Venerable Wu Ping, Fr Brian Sparksman and others. The discussions and debates over lunch and during the afternoon session were lively and rewarding. Further bonds of friendship were cemented as community members came together to voice their hope for the region.

Challenges/risks as we progress

Challenges in the work of interfaith relationships are many. The main challenge is, of course, hate/racism present in our society and born out of:

- a) Fear, or
- b) generalisation of the particular to the whole
- c) populism (within religions and within democratic societies)
