Process

By-Laws

By-law Q2.2.13(2) states "At least 50% of persons to be declared elected to fill the required number of elected positions at the Synod must be female."

Example scenario, if there are four vacancies, at least two people elected must be female and the two females with the highest votes will be elected, regardless of how many votes male nominees receive. If there are insufficient female nominees (e.g., 0 nominees), the two positions remain vacant and will be filled as a casual vacancy pursuant to Q2.2.14.
